Supervisor Simpson called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

**LA Group – First Wilderness Heritage Corridor presentation**: Jim Martin of the LA Group gave a presentation on the First Wilderness Heritage Corridor plan they are working on for the Town of Horicon. They will have one more meeting before finalizing the Horicon plan.

## Local Board of Health...

A Motion was made by Councilperson Olson, seconded by Councilperson Higgins, to go into session as the Local Board of Health. The Board moved into session as Local Board of Health at 7:24 PM.

# **Public Hearing** -Remington (Wesleyan Church) septic variance request / tax map #88.7-1-3:

- -Supervisor Simpson opened the public hearing for the septic variance request at 6692 State Route 8.
- -Tom Hutchins, Hutchins Engineering, reviewed the proposal to install a replacement wastewater disposal system designed to serve a proposed three-bedroom residence.
- -Councilperson Olson asked if this is the same system that was proposed for a previous project at this location. Mr. Hutchins responded that conceptually it is the same system, however it is sized smaller.

Supervisor Simpson said there is no other location on the property for the system. He added that it is definitely better than what is currently there and will alleviate the existing issues.

# **RESOLUTION #107-2019**

Councilperson Olson and Councilperson Higgins introduced Res. No. 107 and moved its adoption: RESOLUTION TO GRANT VARIANCE FOR A REPLACEMENT SEPTIC SYSTEM AT 6692 STATE ROUTE 8

RESOLVED, that the Horicon Town Board acting as Local Board of Health, based on the receipt of a set of stamped plans from Hutchins Engineering (project #291312A-01), and the \$100.00 variance fee, does hereby grant a variance for a replacement septic system at 6692 State Route 8, Brant Lake (Tax Map #88.7-1-30) because the strict application of the minimum setback requirements, or the minimum lot size requirement, would result in a specified practical difficulty to the applicant. Further, the alternative proposed would not be materially detrimental to the purpose of this regulation, or to the property or natural resources in the area in or near the site of the proposed individual sewage disposal system, or otherwise conflict with the description, purpose, or the objectives of any plan or policy of the Town, and that the alternative proposed is the minimum variance which would alleviate the specified practical difficulty as found by the Board to affect the applicant. # <u>Septic Variance request for 206 East Shore Dr / Derr / tax map #36.3-3-15:</u>

-Zack Monroe, Winchip Engineering, explained the proposal to install a replacement wastewater disposal system on the Derr's property that will serve an existing three-bedroom home. Mr. Monroe said there are currently

two seepage pits on the property which they plan to remove. They will replace the seepage pits with an aerobic enhanced treatment unit which is designed to maximize all of the separation distances. He added this is the best, and only, location on the property to place the system. Mr. Monroe explained that the proposed system would require the following variances: 1) proposed absorption field to drilled well #1, 100' required, 78.6' proposed, variance of 21.4' requested; 2) proposed absorption field to drilled well #2, 100' required, 49.6' proposed, variance of 50.4' requested; 3) proposed absorption field to drilled well #3, 100' required, 93.8' proposed, variance of 6.2' requested; 4) proposed absorption field to property line, 10' required, 5.8' proposed, variance of 4.2' requested; 5) proposed absorption field to existing home, 20' required, 5.6' proposed, variance of 14.4' requested.

- -Councilperson Olson said this seems to be a pretty severe request in his view and would like to refer this to Cedarwood for review. He asked what would be in the flow path of the system. Mr. Monroe said the only well that is in the direct flow path is the owner's well and they will be providing UV treatment on the owner's well. Councilperson Olson said he does not feel qualified to make a decision on this and would like Cedarwood to review the proposal.
- -ZA Steen said, in his opinion, he does not feel it is necessary to refer this to Cedarwood. He said Winchip Engineering is proposing a Norweco system along with UV treatment of the well. ZA Steen noted that if a standard system was being proposed he would agree that it should be referred, but in this case being that it is an enhanced treatment system he feels it is unnecessary.
- -Councilperson Hill and Higgins agreed with Councilperson Olson that it should be referred to Cedarwood as the proposed separation distances seem very tight.

# <u>Septic Variance request for 2 Burnt Pond Estates Rd / Cowell / tax map #105.-2-19:</u>

- -Zack Monroe, Winchip Engineering, explained the proposal to install a new enhanced treatment unit, a Presby system, that is designed to serve a new four-bedroom home. He said they are requesting a 58.3' variance for the proposed absorption field to the mean high-water mark of Burnt Pond where 100' is required and they are proposing a 41.7' setback. Mr. Monroe noted this parcel is mostly ledge and what is not ledge is almost vertical, therefore this is the farthest area from the lake that provides adequate soil for placement of the system. He said there is an existing cabin on the property but does not know if there is any type of septic system there.
- -Supervisor Simpson asked if Cowell's are planning on building on the property; Mr. Monroe said yes. He then asked what the difference is between the Presby and the Norweco systems. Mr. Monroe explained they both use their own system, but both accomplish the same thing, and both are classified as NSF 40 approved enhanced treatment systems.

## New Business...

<u>Compensation for Interim Town Justice:</u> Supervisor Simpson said Dave Cavanaugh has asked for the balance of the prior Justice's salary. He said Mr. Cavanaugh gets a stipend of \$125 per court session from OCA but he is requesting further compensation. Supervisor Simpson said the Board is not obligated to compensate him. The Board agreed he will not receive compensation from the Town as he is already getting paid.

1881 Union Church Project: Supervisor Simpson said the 1881 Union Church project should be done next week.

<u>Electronics Recycling Fee:</u> Supervisor Simpson said he was recently notified that the Town's pricing structure from the electronics recycler is based on a rebate the recycler receives from DEC. If the Town charges a fee for disposal of electronics then it violates the DEC rebate, DEC will not give the recycler the rebate, and the Town will end up paying a higher fee to the recycler. Supervisor Simpson said they can either waive the Landfill fee for the disposal of electronics and assume the cost, or they can raise the fee to the residents. The Board agreed to waive the fee for now and then monitor the costs and make changes accordingly. Supervisor Simpson will confirm with the County what the effective date of this change will be and then notify the Landfill.

#### **RESOLUTION #119-2019**

Councilperson Olson and Councilperson Higgins introduced Res. No. 119 and moved its adoption:

# **RESOLUTION TO ELIMINATE FEE FOR DISPOSAL OF ELECTRONICS**

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Horicon does hereby amend the Horicon Landfill fee schedule to eliminate the fee for disposal of electronics at the Landfill.

<u>Fountain Repair:</u> Supervisor Simpson said the fountain repair should be complete around the middle of the first week in October. He said Roger Houck recommends sealing the fountain in the spring each year.

# Privilege of the Floor...

-Rich Nawrot asked if the Town is considering re-instating the BTI program. Supervisor Simpson said they did get a quote for the BTI program and it was about \$90,000 - \$100,000 for a three-year program. He explained that for reference, \$15,000 is all that can be raised in taxes in order to stay under the tax cap, therefore the Board does not feel this is feasible. It was noted that other towns have the program but are paying less than what was quoted to Horicon and they still have black flies. There was further discussion on the topic. The Board feels the cost is too great.
