Local Board of Health:

A Motion was made by Councilperson Olson, seconded by Councilperson Higgins, to go into session as the Local Board of Health. The Board moved into session as Local Board of Health at 7:00 PM.

Request for Septic Variance at 215 East Shore Dr / Tax Map #36.3-3-8 / Larschan

ZA Jim Steen explained the applicant, represented by Robert Tomlins, ECT Enterprises NY LLC, is seeking two variances for their property at 215 East Shore Drive in Adirondack. The first variance is necessary because the separation distance between the absorption field to the mean high-water mark of the lake is only 40' not the required 100'. The second variance is necessary because the separation distance from the absorption field to the dwelling is only 10' not the required 20'. ZA Steen said a 1250-gallon tank is being proposed to accommodate the four-bedroom house, and the engineer has determined the Eljen system is suitable to treat the capacity of the house. Councilman Hill asked if it could be moved closer to the road. ZA Steen said there really are no other placement options for the system due to the proximity of the surrounding wells. Councilman Hill asked if this would require a monitoring system. ZA Steen said it does not because it is not an aerobic treatment unit, it is a sand filtering leach system. Councilman Higgins asked if this was an expansion. ZA Steen clarified that this is replacement of a failing system not an expansion. The Board had no further questions and deemed the application complete.

WHEREAS, the former Camp Gabriels Correctional Facility was closed by New York State in 2009 and has been vacant and unused since that time; and

WHEREAS, when the State took possession of the original 220.9 acres in 1982, they did add 129.2 acres of the property to the forest preserve; and

WHEREAS, the 91.7 acres which is Camp Gabriels was already developed and has a long history of occupation and extensive use since the late 19th century and is inconsistent with the "forever wild" provision; and

WHEREAS, as stated in the deed, those 91.7 acres are inconsistent with the "forever wild" provision, as they contain 55 buildings, roads, a self-contained waste water treatment plant, heating plant, wells and water distribution system and a back-up generator capable of keeping the facility secure in the event of a North Country power outage; and WHEREAS, New York State conducted several auctions to sell the Camp Gabriels property; and

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WHEREAS, a prospective private purchaser was unable to complete the purchase or obtain title insurance because this property is located within the Adirondack Park and potentially subject to the "forever wild" provision in the State Constitution; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of economic development in the Adirondack North Country communities that this property and facility be unencumbered for private purchase and put to good use in the region; NOW THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town of Horicon hereby supports a state-wide referendum by the voters of New York State that this property be unencumbered for private purchase, exempt from the "forever wild" clause in the State Constitution, and not be added to the forest preserve.

Committee Reports

-Councilperson Sylvia Smith updated the Board on the following: Horicon section of the Southern Adirondack Guide has been edited and submitted, and a notice has been sent to local businesses who may want to advertise; Boat Stewards have been interviewed, and ten senior stewards have been hired along with five students; Beautification/Cemetery crew has been working on cleaning up downed trees from a recent storm, and a tree surgeon has been contacted about removing at least two other trees in the Brant Lake Cemetery; the cemetery barn in South Horicon was damaged in the recent storm and the engineer is expected to submit his report on whether the building should be torn down or repaired on Monday; the flowers will be planted in the next week or two, and the goal is to have them finished by Memorial Day but there is no guarantee. Councilperson Smith said she and Councilperson Hill have received several designs for the sign post/holder for the banners (which she passed out to the Board members and asked for their opinion). She and Councilperson Hill recommend the design submitted by

Garnet Signs at a cost of \$745.00 as it will match the Brant Lake sign across the road. Councilperson Smith asked the Board which projects they want to submit grant applications for through the Community Fund for Gore Mountain Region this year. There was discussion on two projects: the bleachers for the Brant Lake ballfield and the playground equipment in Adirondack. Councilperson Smith noted the Memorial Day Parade lineup will be at 9:30 on Horicon Ave and the parade will step off at 10:00 am. She said the Board has been invited to the Lake George military monument dedication at 11:00 am May 19th. Lastly, Councilperson Smith invited the Board members to attend the annual YMCA breakfast on June 26th.

-Councilperson Frank Hill reviewed two quotes for the tennis court repairs with the Board. There was discussion as to where the money would come from to pay for the repairs, and whether it was absolutely necessary that the repairs be done this year. Councilpersons Hill and Higgins will take another look at the courts and report back next month.

-Robert French, NWEMS representative, told the Board things at the NWEMS seem to be headed in a positive direction. He said they are still making improvements, and they are making all first calls.

Old Business...

Sign Post for Banners: Supervisor Simpson asked which design the Board would like for the sign post. Councilperson Olson noted the sign post he designed did not require a zoning permit; he then asked if the cable on the sign post proposed by Garnet Signs would make it a structure and therefore require a zoning permit. ZA Steen replied a sign is a sign, and furthermore, the Zoning Ordinance indicates municipal signs are exempt, so a permit would not be needed. The rest of the Board members agreed they liked the design from Garnet Signs.

Letter folder/inserter: Supervisor Simpson said the Town has received several quotes for a letter folder/inserter machine; two quotes on a new machine and one quote on a used machine. The Board asked the Clerk to have the sales rep bring the used machine up for a demonstration for the Community Center staff.

Community Fund for Gore Mt. Region grant application: The Board agreed they will submit two grant applications to CFGMR; one for the playground equipment in Adirondack and one for bleachers for the Brant Lake ball field.

Southern Adirondack Magazine Ad: RESOLUTION #96-2018 Councilperson Smith and Councilperson Hill introduced Res. No. 96 and moved its adoption:
