## Committee Reports ....

-Councilperson Geraci reported on the following:

Personnel: The sub-committee that has been appointed to revise the Employee Handbook has their first meeting scheduled for October 27<sup>th</sup> at 9:00am. The plan is to review the handbook and suggest revisions. *NWEMS*: There were 50 calls for the month with 12 in Horicon, 26 in Chestertown, and 12 mutual aid calls. The annual donation campaign is well underway and has now exceeded \$35,000.00. The funds will be used to supplement some of the operating costs. On October 7, he, along with several members of EMS squads and other Town Supervisors in the County, attended a sub-committee meeting to discuss the possibility of creating a county-wide EMS Division. This is simply a fact-finding mission at this point. There are several towns in the County that are having significant staffing issues like North Warren. Additionally, the various squads compete for the same staff members which mean the current system is not sustainable. If created, funding would partially occur through creation of an EMS tax district as well as patient reimbursements. There was an excellent overall agreement that this issue must be further studied and acted on in a timely manner. The Post-Star covered the meeting and published an article, and the Chronicle also recently published a related article. Discussions will continue as meetings are called by Warrensburg Town Supervisor,

Kevin Geraghty, who is Chair of the sub-committee. On November 4 the Horicon Town Board will hold a joint meeting with the Chestertown Town Board to discuss what is going on with the NWEMS in the two towns and to look at the financials. The meeting will be held at 7:00pm at the Horicon Community Center.

-Councilperson Hill reported on the following:

Beautification: Fall cleanup is underway.

*Museums*: The museums have been closed for the season. There is a water leak in the sump pump at the Museum Annex that needs to be addressed. Jason Hill showed Rob how to shut the water off for the season. *Landfill*: Barb has done a good job at the Landfill cleaning things up and it looks good.

-Councilperson Palmer: Nothing to report.

-Councilperson Olson reported on the following:

*ZBA & PB*: There was a holdup recently with a request before the ZBA. The ZBA worked through it quickly and held a special meeting so they would not hold up the applicant. He noted that the ZBA and Planning Board do a good job and they do well serving the citizens of the community. Bill McGhie, Planning Board Chair, has sadly resigned effective December 31<sup>st</sup> and this will be a loss to the Town. He has done an excellent job over the years.

*Historian:* He read in the Historian's report that someone is writing a book about Teddy Roosevelt. He noted there is a picture of Teddy standing on a porch with a resident; the home burned down some time later. He said he built a vacation home on the site where the picture was taken and learned an interesting fact about the picture. He said the Town resident standing with Teddy Roosevelt was an attorney named Abel Crook.

-Supervisor Smith reported on the following:

*Assessor:* She congratulated Assessor Christine Hayes on her current appointment as Vice President of the NYS Assessor's Association, noting that in 2022 Christine will become the President of the NYSAA.

*Youth Commission:* The committee will meet on October 25<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am at the Town of Chester municipal center. She thanked Kaitlyn Hill for keeping things moving forward and stressed this program is a great thing for the North Warren kids.

*Buildings:* NY Fire and Security was given the approval by the Board to update the current system. However, even though they have the main panel, they are having difficulty getting the parts in to complete the update. They have been to the Community Center several times to fix some issues.

The County came up to hang the new NYS flag with HS Darian Granger and Town employee Rob Wallace assisting them.

Bill Millington has ordered the new door for Patty's office from three different companies and nothing is available. He will take the first one that comes in.

Matt Lynch, a Brant Lake resident, has asked if he can donate a couple of benches or a sign in honor of his parents 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary to support the Beautification program in town. The Board is fine with this. *Boat Launch:* October 11<sup>th</sup> was the last day for the Boat Stewards. She noted that they have done a great job juggling schedules with AWI. Jim Fitzpatrick, who works for AWI, also helped so there would be coverage at both launches as needed.

*Covid*: There were 30 new cases of Covid in the county yesterday (Oct 20<sup>th</sup>) and there are currently over 400 being monitored. She noted that 100% of the employees in the Community Center as well as 100% of the Town Board members are vaccinated. Ginelle Jones gave accolades to the Town's Highway Department as they have the highest vaccination rate among Highway Departments in the County having only one employee left that is not vaccinated. Ginelle would like to do an ad based on Horicon to sell the benefits of being vaccinated to other towns in the County.

*Septic transfer:* The County has voted to bring the septic transfer law that is being researched to a public hearing. This law would allow Warren County to handle the septic approvals involving waterfront properties instead of the towns, however, this needs more research. Horicon has the most waterfront in the County and it was noted that all waterfront needs to be included. There will be a public hearing on November 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm at the Lake George Town Hall on this topic. There will also be another public hearing at the Warren County Board of Supervisors meeting on November 19<sup>th</sup>. Anyone wishing to attend is encouraged to do so because the people need to be heard on this.

-Landfill Supervisor Barb French reported that the copper has been taken to R. Cohen, the bottles are all cleaned up, the tires have been taken away, and the batteries have been cleaned up; the Town has been paid for all of it. She also cancelled the water service from Crystal Rock because they would not deliver on days the Landfill

was open. She reminded the Board that the contract for the bottle pickup is due to renew in December.

#### Old Business...

-New Highway Pickup: The Clerk advertised for bids for the new Highway pickup, and one bid was received from Warren Ford.
