# Septic Variance request for 73 North Beaver Pond Rd / Llewelyn / tax map #38.1-1-25:

-Bret Winchip, Winchip Engineering, reviewed the proposed plan to install a replacement wastewater disposal system to serve an existing three-bedroom home. He said there is no obvious failure of the existing system but they want to avert any issues since the home is close to the pond. Mr. Winchip explained the proposed plan will eliminate four non-conformities, and they are requesting three variances as follows:

# <u>Eliminated non-conformities</u>:

- -Existing seepage pit to mean high water. 100' required, 42.6' actual, which is a nonconformity of 57.4' or 57.4%.
- -Existing septic tank to mean high water. 50' required, 45.5' actual, which is a nonconformity of 4.5' or 9.0%.
- -Existing seepage pit to clients drilled well. 150' required, 94.0' actual, which is a non-conformity of 56.0' or 37.3%.
- -Existing septic tank to house. 10' required, 1.8' actual, which is a non-conformity of 8.2' or 82.0% . Requested Variances:
  - -Proposed septic tank to mean high water. 50' required, 44.4' proposed, which is a variance of 5.6' or 11.2%.
  - -Proposed pump station to mean high water. 50' required, 44.2' proposed, which is a variance of 5.8' or 11.6%
  - -Proposed field. 15% maximum allowed, 20.6% proposed, which is a variance of delta 4.6% or 37.3%.
- -Councilman Olson asked ZA Magee if the application is complete, and ZA Magee said it is complete.

Councilman Palmer said, in regard to taking brush at the Landfill, he talked to Benny Newton who explained a chipper will not work because the brush has to be neatly stacked. Councilman Palmer said Mr. Newton suggested stockpiling the brush and getting a tub grinder to come in and process it. Mr. Palmer said the cost to process a stockpile the size of Mr. Newton's garage would be between \$5,000 and \$6,000. He said he talked with Barb French and that is what they are going to try. -Councilman Rob Hill spoke to Northwoods Concrete regarding the sidewalk in front of the Town Hall and they will provide a quote for the work. He said the Rotary wants to do a Small Business assistance initiative where they will go out to small businesses with minimal workforce and help out for the day as a way to give back to the community.
