

This permit does not have to be recorded in the County Clerk's Office.

#### **SUMMARY AND AUTHORIZATION**

This permit authorizes a one-time application of an herbicide in Brant Lake, in the Town of Horicon, Warren County.

The project shall not be undertaken or continued unless the project authorized herein is in existence by June 30, 2025. The Agency will consider the project in existence upon commencement of the herbicide application.

The project shall be undertaken in compliance with all conditions stated herein. Failure to comply with this permit is a violation and may subject the permittee, successors, and assigns to civil penalties and other legal proceedings.

This permit does not convey any right to trespass upon the lands or interfere with the riparian rights of others in order to undertake the authorized project, nor does it authorize the impairment of any easement, right, title or interest in real or personal property.

Nothing contained in this permit shall be construed to satisfy any legal obligations of the permittee to comply with all applicable laws and regulations or to obtain any governmental approval or permit from any entity other than the Agency, whether federal, State, regional, or local.

#### **PROJECT SITE**

The project site is approximately 164 acres of deep-water marsh wetland with a maximum value rating of "1", within five treatment areas in Brant Lake in the Town of Horicon, Warren County.

#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project as conditionally approved herein involves the application of the aquatic herbicide ProcellaCOR EC (EPA Registration Number 67690-80; New York Special Local Needs Label Registration #SLN NY-19001) in Brant Lake for purposes of controlling Eurasian watermilfoil (*Myriophyllum spicatum*). In total, the permittee will apply up to 65 gallons of ProcellaCOR EC within five treatment areas totaling approximately 164 acres in Brant Lake; a permit is required from the Agency for application within the jurisdictional wetland areas.

An application to the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation Bureau of Pesticides Management is pending.

Following the treatment, the Brant Lake Foundation will continue to manage Eurasian watermilfoil in Brant Lake, using hand harvesting/diver assisted suction harvesting and/or benthic barrier installation techniques as currently permitted by Agency Permit 2016-0043.

The project is shown on the following maps, plans, and reports:

- A map titled "2023 Eurasian Watermilfoil Control Plan," prepared by Solitude Lake Management, dated March 14, 2023, and received by the Agency on March 15, 2023 (the Project Map);
- A plan titled "Brant Lake 2023 ProcellaCOR EC Sampling Plan," received by the Agency on February 28, 2023, supplemented by a letter dated January 16, 2024 from Glenn Sullivan of Ready Scout, LLC to Aaron Ziemann, received by the Agency on January 16, 2024 (together, the Sampling Plan):
- A report titled "2022 Brant Lake AIS Survey," prepared by Adirondack Research, dated December 2022, and received by the Agency on February 28, 2023, supplemented by a report titled, "2023 Brant Lake AIS Plant Survey," prepared by Adirondack Research, dated August 2023, and received by the Agency on December 14, 2023 (together, the Plant Surveys).

A copy of the Project Map is attached as a part of this permit for easy reference.

#### **AGENCY JURISDICTION**

The project consists of the application of an herbicide within wetlands and requires an Agency permit pursuant to 9 NYCRR Sections 578.2 and 578.3(n)(2)(i).

#### **CONDITIONS**

#### THE PROJECT IS APPROVED SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

1. This permit is binding on the permittee, all present and future owners or lessees of the project site, and all persons undertaking all or a portion of the project.

Copies of this permit shall be furnished by the permittee and/or any subsequent owner or lessee to all persons undertaking the activities authorized herein.

- 2. In addition to complying with all terms and conditions of this permit, all future activities on the project site shall be undertaken in compliance with the requirements of New York State's Adirondack Park Agency Act, Freshwater Wetlands Act, and the Adirondack Park Agency's implementing regulations [9 NYCRR §§ 570-588].
- 3. This permit authorizes a one-time application of the aquatic herbicide ProcellaCOR EC, between May 15 and June 30 of 2024 or 2025, within wetlands, in the locations shown on the Project Map and as described in any issued Department of Environmental Conservation Permit. The liquid herbicide shall be mixed with water on the application vessel before being injected below the water surface.
- 4. Prior to being brought on site, all equipment (including but not limited to boats, trailers, anchors, ropes/lines, and internal and external pumps, hoses, and storage or mixing tanks) that will be placed in or over the water shall meet the Clean Drain Dry standard as set forth on the DEC website. Disinfection, if necessary, shall also be done prior to being brought on site and shall be done in accordance with procedures outlined on the DEC website.
- 5. Post-treatment herbicide residue monitoring shall occur at the five locations shown and with the frequency described in the Sampling Plan. A post-treatment herbicide monitoring report shall be provided to the Agency by December 1 of the treatment year and shall include an assessment and discussion of all monitoring results for each sampling event.
- 6. A post-treatment aquatic plant survey shall be completed between August 1 and September 15 of the treatment year. The survey shall repeat the methodology used in the Plant Surveys.
  - The post-treatment status report shall be provided to the Agency by December 1 of the treatment year. The report shall include the results of the post-treatment aquatic plant survey, including any Eurasian watermilfoil not lethally controlled by the treatment observed at or adjacent to any post-treatment survey site but not captured by rake toss; a table identifying the GPS coordinates of each sample site; and a map and table identifying the GPS coordinates of any Eurasian watermilfoil not lethally controlled by the treatment observed outside any post-treatment survey site. The report shall also include a narrative assessment of the overall health and effects of treatment on the plant community of Brant Lake.
- 7. Any change to any aspect of the project, including but not limited to the treatment locations, application rate, or concentration, or to the post-treatment monitoring, shall require prior written Agency authorization.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

The Agency has considered all statutory and regulatory criteria for project approval set forth in the Freshwater Wetlands Act and 9 NYCRR Part 578. The Agency hereby finds:

- a. that the project as authorized herein will meet all of the pertinent requirements and conditions of the approved local land use program of the Town of Horicon;
- b. that the project authorized as conditioned herein will be consistent with the Adirondack Park land use and development plan:
- that the project authorized as conditioned herein will not have an undue adverse impact upon the natural, scenic, aesthetic, ecological, wildlife, historic, recreational or open space resources of the Park, taking into account the economic and social or other benefits to be derived from the activity; and
- d. the economic, social and other benefits to be derived from the activity proposed and as conditioned herein compel a departure from the guidelines of 9 NYCRR Part 578.10(a)(1), in order to secure the natural benefits of wetlands associated with the project, consistent with the general welfare and beneficial economic, social, and agricultural development of the state.



The Horicon Fire Department had a relatively quiet winter season. We had 23 calls between November and March, most of these being alarm investigations, storm-related responses and EMS assistance. We received a total of 83 calls for the year 2023. Our firefighters would like to thank everyone who donated toward our annual winter fund-letter drive. We would also like to thank the Town Highway Dept. for keeping our parking lots clear over the winter months.

In November we purchased a new AED for our rescue truck to replace an aging unit which was no longer serviceable. Our members completed their CPR refresher certification this past January, which is required every 2 years. In February we had our ground & roof ladders load-tested for functionality and strength. Additionally, our air packs and facemasks were inspected and serviced to ensure safe operating condition. These inspections and tests were performed by Dival Safety out of Albany.

We would like to acknowledge Joann Lewis for 55 years of volunteer service with the Horicon FD Ladies Auxiliary. Joann spent many hours in our firehouse kitchen preparing breakfast or dinner for our firefighters and was always ready and willing to lend a helping hand with Auxiliary-sponsored fundraisers and the various community events held at our station over the years. Joann passed away in December at 80 years old.

This spring we purchased and installed an Extractor washing machine for cleaning and decontaminating turnout gear. The specialized appliance was paid for with donation money and will help bring our station in line with modern day health & safety expectations.

We want to remind residents of our town to make sure your home street address is visible from the road. We've had a few instances within the last year of driving past residences due to address numbers either being blocked from view, illegible, or placed too far back from the roadway. The longer it takes fire, EMS and police personnel to find your home, the longer it takes to respond and render necessary assistance. Some helpful hints:

- Keep the immediate areas around mailboxes or driveway signs clear of tall grass or tall flowers.
- Replace torn, faded, or missing adhesive numbers on mailboxes or signs.
- Ensure address text is large enough to be seen on approach; 3" minimum text height recommended by the entrance to driveways.
- Using reflective decals or signs will allow responders to locate your home easier after dark.

Spring and Summer are upon us and with warmer months come the increase of people enjoying outdoor fires. Below are some simple guidelines to follow to ensure your campfire experience remains an enjoyable one and doesn't get out of control:

- Keep outdoor fires under 4 feet in width or diameter in accordance with NYS DEC guidelines.
- Refrain from leaving outdoor fires unattended. However, if you do have to leave a fire, ensure
  ashes and unburned wood are fully extinguished before departing. Wet them down, stir with a
  stick or poker, and wet them again until they're cool to the touch.
- If no water is nearby, smother the ashes with dirt or sand.
- Keep immediate areas around outdoor fireplaces clear of dry leaves, dead grass, brush, trash, or other debris.
- It's recommended that landowners obtain a burn permit whenever burning brush. Burn permits can be obtained free of charge at Mountain Hardware in Chestertown. Please notify the Warren
