#### **RESOLUTION #144-2024**

Councilmember Schuerlein and Councilmember Francisco introduced Res. No. 144 and moved its adoption: **RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PAYMENT TO HANK'S QUALITY FLOORING** 

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Horicon does hereby authorize a 50% deposit be paid to Hank's Quality Flooring Inc. in the amount of \$1,683.00 for the new carpet in the Assessor's office. Ayes: 5 (Schuerlein, Francisco, Hodgson, Sim, Geraci) Nays: 0

Supervisor Geraci took a motion from Councilmember Hodgson, seconded by Councilmember Schuerlein, to open the public hearing for the Preliminary 2025 Budget.

Supervisor Geraci gave a presentation outlining the Preliminary 2025 Budget (*see presentation attached*).

Supervisor Geraci asked if anyone had any questions or comments.

Councilmembers Sim, Hodgson, and Schuerlein said they are fine with the budget.

Councilmember Francisco said, as he expressed before, he is not in agreement with the 14% increase for the NWEMS Ambulance District. He questioned Rob Smith, Horicon representative to the NWEMS, on the increase. Rob explained that when the Ambulance District was created the Squad presented a budget amount to the Towns of Horicon and Chester, but the amount they requested was cut back which put them behind. He said the amount requested for 2025 will bring them up to where they need to be. Rob said this is the amount the Squad needs to have staff 24/7, and to cover expenses for equipment, insurance, building repairs, etc. He also pointed out that they are competing with other squads for members and must offer competitive salaries and benefits. He said the only other sources of revenue they have are donations and some revenue recovery. Councilmember Francisco said he just wanted to know if the increase is 14% this year, then what is it going to be next year. Rob, again, pointed out that the Squad was behind after being cut last year, but this increase will bring them up to where they need to be; he expects that going forward the requests will be more in line with the other Town services.

Supervisor Geraci pointed out that public safety is expensive, and the Town has looked at the various EMS options over the years. He said a Town does not have to have EMS services; however, the County, the Adirondack Association of Towns and Villages, etc. have been advocating to the State legislature to change that because it will help the Town acquire additional funding for services.

There being no further comment from the public, Councilmember Schuerlein made a Motion, seconded by Councilmember Francisco, to close the Public Hearing. The Public Hearing was closed at 6:30 pm.




**Property Tax Distribution 2025** Total Tax Warrant: \$4,010,339.48
